CEO UPDATE

I'm delighted to welcome you to this latest edition of Community Matters, filled with some fantastic stories, reflections and a glimpse of what's ahead at CLA.

Over the past few months of rather chilly days, we've continued to see the strength of our community in action whether through the growth of our Drive Forward program, the vibrant energy at our Social Sports sessions, or the joy of seeing SingAbility preparing for its big-screen debut. These programs don't just exist they flourish because of the passion, ideas and effort each of you brings every day.

One of the most exciting recent developments is the successful grant we received for a new shade sail to be installed over the rear right outdoor space at our 56 Cockburn Road site. This initiative will help us transform that area into a more welcoming, accessible and functional space for participants, families, and staff. It's another step in our ongoing effort to reimagine how we use our facilities to maximise inclusion, comfort and creativity.

We are also continuing to recover from the severe weather event earlier this year that impacted both our 36 and 56 Cockburn Road sites. While the cleanup was swift thanks to the efforts of our incredible team, the longer-term repairs insurance claims have taken time. We are now finalising settlement with our insurers and taking the opportunity to not just restore but improve key parts of our facilities. It's been a complex process, but one that reflects our ongoing commitment to resilience, quality and future readiness.

Our Drive Forward program continues to gather momentum. With a full schedule of learner drivers, a state-of-the-art simulator, and a dedicated crew of instructors and coaches (yes, we see you, Erica & Kelli and our fearless external provider Jay!), we're that regional innovation proving disability support is not just possible it's powerful. A special thanks to Department of Transport for their support, and to Shannon for engineering a simulator that has truly set a new benchmark.


Ethan snapped up a cancelled PDA booking and successfully passed his test. Time to reverse roles and be his mum's taxi driver.




Rain, hail or shine, Zoe will no longer be walking to school. Zoe joined the Drive Forward program to complete her required hours and passed first time.














Due to the popularity of our Drive Forward program, we are currently at capacity for participants with a newly acquired Learners permit.
